The amount you spend depends on your skincare concerns, but the experts agree this is a 'get what you pay for' category. You need the best ingredients to deal effectively with issues such as spots, lines, pigmentation or dryness. **Best new buys:** Steven Victor Bio-Nutritive Luxury Cream, £300 (exclusive to Harvey Nichols); Elemis Pro-Collagen Wrinkle Smooth, £185; ESPA Concept Regenerating Face Treatment Oil, £52.

- Make-up artist Ashley Ward says: 'Before I apply make-up, I use SKI Signs Eye Mask, £45, Chanel Precision Calming Emulsion, £27, and Shu Uemura's hydrating Depose Water, £10, in whichever aroma the client likes.' She uses Elemis Pro-Collagen Marine Cream, £75, and Gentle Rose Exfoliator, £22, on her own skin.
- Celebrity facialist and L'Oréal Paris skincare specialist, Nichola Joss, is often booked for lymphatic drainage massage facials by her clients Elizabeth Hurley, Anna Friel and Kate Moss. For this she uses L'Oréal Paris Immortelle Elixir, £35, a dry oil that promises to reduce wrinkles by up to 38% in four weeks.
